INTRODUCTION

St. George's College Sixth Form Pre-University Programme requires an elevated level of personal dedication and endeavour to guarantee success. The school policy regarding Sixth Form studies includes ongoing reviews of achievement, academically and socially throughout the school year.

The inability of a student to meet required standards will be addressed by way of consultation with his/her parents or guardian. Goals for improvement will be established and subsequent monitoring of student implemented. Further evaluation of the students' tenure in Sixth Form will follow if he/she fails to meet the St. George's College required standards.

CRITERIA FOR ENTRY TO SIXTH FORM

1. Applicants should be under 18 years old at the point of submitting the application.
2. A minimum of six (6) CSEC subjects preferably at one sitting with ones (1's) and twos (2's) or GCE O'Level with A or B in subjects to be pursued at the CAPE level. Applicants MUST have passed English Language and Mathematics.
3. Applicants will be required to do three (3) CAPE level subjects in addition to Communication Studies and Caribbean Studies in the subject groupings offered over the two years.
4. A non-refundable processing fee of two thousand dollars (\$3000) must be paid, in full, at the Office of the Bursar. Return the application form, with proof of payment (stamped), to the Office of the Dean of Sixth Form or the Office of the Vice Principal–Upper School.
5. Applicants should submit application by August 25, 2017. (Submit the application and all relevant documents to St. George's College in a legal size (long) file jacket marked:

6. The application MUST be accompanied by a hand written PERSONAL STATEMENT of at least 150 words stating your reasons for entry to St. G.C. Sixth Form. Also, you are required to submit an outline of your long term goals and objectives.
7. The applicant should present two (2) passport size photographs, Birth Certificate and Examination results (original and a copy), and recommendation from your principal/vice principal under confidential cover – using the recommendation form attached.

CRITERIA FOR ENTRY cont'd...

8. Successful applicants will be contacted to attend an interview; If you are advised of an interview please ensure that all of your relevant documents are available (the original and a copy).
9. Upon receiving your acceptance letter, all applicants MUST pay the total School Fee before starting classes in September.
10. St. George's College reserves the right to deny any application. The Principal's decision is final.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

1. Class attendance is compulsory.
2. Assignments MUST be completed to required standard and on time.
3. Students are expected to maintain the minimum average established for the Sixth Form Programme.
4. Recommended texts should be acquired at the beginning of the course of study.
5. Resource Centres such as the computer lab, Audio Visual Room and the library should be used to facilitate completion of assignments.

SOCIAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Proper school uniform MUST be worn at all times.
2. Students MUST attend school by 7:45 a.m. daily.
3. All school rules for conduct and behaviour MUST be adhered to with no exceptions.
4. Excellent behaviour and conduct MUST be demonstrated to all members of the school community, including students in 1st – 5th Forms and to colleagues in Sixth Form.
5. Participation in clubs and society activities is mandatory.
6. Community Service, Retreats and Ethics programme, where and when required MUST be completed.

PREPARATION FOR TERTIARY STUDIES

1. Applications to a local/international university MUST be made before January of the upper sixth year.
2. All students MUST apply for entry to a university.
3. Applications for scholarships require the highest level of attainment in academic and social activities throughout the Lower and Upper Sixth Form years.
